







Event Announcement: Antietam Creek Watershed Report Card Reception & Land Stewardship Drop-In



HAGERSTOWN, MD (May 27, 2025) – The Antietam-Conococheague Watershed Alliance (ACWA) & the Beaver Creek Watershed Association (BCWA) have announced a reception event to reveal the first Antietam Watershed Report Card to the public. The event will also provide community members an opportunity to meet various organizations and environmental practitioners to learn methods and funding sources to improve their personal land stewardship practices.

Watershed report cards are powerful tools used around the world to describe ecosystem status, increase public awareness, and inform decision makers. The Antietam Watershed Report Card evaluates the Antietam and its drainage area within Washington County, MD using nine indicators in three categories: water quality, biota, and landscape with data collected by ACWA\BCWA's Community Science volunteers, MD DNR, and Potomac Riverkeeper Network. The report card was developed by ACWA, BCWA, and the University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science (UMCES).

Attend the event to receive a copy of the report card, learn how the watershed's grade was determined, and hear about projects planned to help improve our report card grade. We will also announce details of new State Whole Watershed Act Funding to assist with Antietam Watershed restoration projects.

Several environmental organizations and stewardship practitioners will be at the event to offer attendees information on sustainable land use practices, discuss potential projects, and explain available funding sources. For instance, property owners can learn how to create sustainable landscaping in their own yards, discuss funding for large- and small-scale tree plantings, and consider healthier agricultural practices to protect soil and water quality.
